Dear Albert Bridge School Family,

I wanted to reach out to you all during this extraordinarily painful time for our nation. This is not new, but has been highlighted once again, as do other expressions of oppression and not being heard. As we take in the atrocities by those in power to those who are marginalized, specifically, our black community over the past few weeks, and consider the prevalence and persistence of these atrocities, this horrible event brings focus to the history of injustice that we must all address together. Sadly, this is only the most recent example of the injustice that has existed for many years. It is painful and shocking to recognize that even in the year 2020 – nearly 60 years after the Civil Rights Act of 1964 – injustice exists to this degree across this country.

At ABS, we are committed to helping us move towards a better understanding and take action towards creating equity. We stand by the AOE's expectation: "Educational equity means that every student has access to the resources, opportunities and educational rigor they need at the right moment in their education, whatever their race, gender/identity, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, language, disability, family background, or family income may be."

I want to remind us all that we, as any community, are as strong as the relationships we build *with* each other. During this time of unrest, uncertainty, and fear, please take care of yourselves, your families, your friends, your communities – and each other.

Dear Parents/Guardians;

We know many of you have been wondering about plans for the fall and are wondering about what school may look like. We are working to address the guidelines of the Vermont Department of Health and Vermont Agency of Education to determine a way to provide our best possible learning experiences in the fall.

The current guidance from the State about reopening in the fall is likely to change. Therefore, we are in the process of developing plans that we think are best for students and have flexibility across a variety of settings (remote, in-person, hybrid).

We will wait until after boards discuss financial issues; the teaching team develops focus around goals and format; and the process becomes more clear before we officially assign teachers to grades. This will allow for flexibility to adjust class sizes and prepare creative programming that will address multiple situations and help us in planning to reopen in person.

We will present the teams and have students start connecting with the many adults once we have a reasonable plan. At ABS, we recognize it takes a village to raise a child and we're committed to creating the best village ever!

Thank you for all your work in sharing in the learning experience, your patience, and your understanding. Please contact us with any questions. As we learn more about what schooling will look like, we will be sure to update the community.




Summer Learning
